

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Mayor and Town Council hereby proclaim October 28th as National Immigrants Day, encouraging all residents to celebrate the rich immigrant experiences within our community, promote inclusivity, and stand in solidarity with our immigrant neighbors.

ORDINANCE 2025-16**

**AN ORDINANCE REGULATING DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITATIONS  
WITHIN THE TOWN OF BRENTWOOD**

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Brentwood Mayor and Council find that unregulated solicitation can lead to harassment of residents, privacy concerns, and public safety issues; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Brentwood seeks to establish reasonable regulations to protect its citizens while respecting constitutional rights. **Section 1. NOW, THEREFORE**, be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the Town of Brentwood, by the Mayor and Council that Chapter 130 "Door-to-Door Solicitations", Article X "Regulations" be adopted and enacted as follows:

**CHAPTER 130 DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITATIONS**

**§ 130-1 PURPOSE**

THE PURPOSE OF THIS ORDINANCE IS TO REGULATE DOOR-TO-DOOR SOLICITATION IN ORDER TO PROTECT THE PEACE, SAFETY, AND PRIVACY OF RESIDENTS WITHIN TOWN OF BRENTWOOD.

**. § 130-2 DEFINITIONS**

FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS ORDINANCE:

- **SOLICITATION MEANS THE ACT OF GOING DOOR-TO-DOOR, OR APPROACHING PERSONS IN PUBLIC OR ON PRIVATE PROPERTY, FOR THE PURPOSE OF:**
  - **SELLING OR OFFERING FOR SALE GOODS, SERVICES, OR SUBSCRIPTIONS;**
  - **REQUESTING DONATIONS FOR ANY CAUSE;**
  - **DISTRIBUTING HANDBILLS OR FLYERS WITH A COMMERCIAL MESSAGE, EXCEPT TOWN OF BRENTWOOD RELATED NOTIFICATIONS.**

- **SOLICITOR MEANS ANY PERSON, WHETHER PRINCIPAL, AGENT, OR EMPLOYEE, WHO ENGAGES IN SOLICITATION AS DEFINED ABOVE.**
- **NON-SOLICITATION SIGN MEANS A SIGN POSTED BY A RESIDENT OR PROPERTY OWNER INDICATING THAT SOLICITORS ARE NOT WELCOME.**

**§ 130-3 PROHIBITION OF SOLICITATION**

**(A) NO PERSON SHALL ENGAGE IN SOLICITATION WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF BRENTWOOD WITHOUT FIRST OBTAINING A PERMIT FROM THE TOWN CLERK OR OTHER DESIGNATED OFFICIAL.**

**(B) SOLICITATION IS PROHIBITED AT ANY PROPERTY CLEARLY DISPLAYING A “NO SOLICITATION”, “NO TRESPASSING”, OR SIMILAR SIGN.**

**(C) SOLICITATION IS PROHIBITED:**

- **BEFORE 9:00 AM AND 1-HOUR AFTER SUNSET**

**§ 130-4. PERMIT APPLICATION**

**(A) ANY PERSON OR ENTITY SEEKING TO ENGAGE IN SOLICITATION SHALL SUBMIT ONE (1) WEEK IN ADVANCE OF SOLICITING A WRITTEN APPLICATION TO THE TOWN CLERK INCLUDING:**

- **NAME, ADDRESS, AND CONTACT INFORMATION;**
- **NATURE OF THE GOODS/SERVICES OR CAUSE;**
- **DATES AND TIMES OF SOLICITATION;**
- **NAMES AND BACKGROUND INFORMATION OF ALL INDIVIDUALS WHO WILL BE SOLICITING.**
- **PAYMENT OF PERMIT APPLICATION FEE**

**(B) A PERMIT MAY BE DENIED IF:**

- **THE APPLICANT HAS BEEN CONVICTED OF A CRIME INVOLVING FRAUD, THEFT, OR VIOLENCE;**
- **THE APPLICATION IS INCOMPLETE OR CONTAINS FALSE INFORMATION.**

**(C) ISSUED PERMITS SHOULD BE AVAILABLE FOR INSPECTION AT ALL TIMES WHEN SOLICITING IN THE TOWN OF BRENTWOOD.**

**§ 130-5. EXEMPTIONS**

**THE FOLLOWING ARE EXEMPT FROM THE PERMIT REQUIREMENT BUT MUST COMPLY WITH TIME AND “NO SOLICITATION” PROVISIONS:**

- **POLITICAL CANVASSING;**
- **RELIGIOUS PROSELYTIZING;**

- CHARITABLE OR NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS REGISTERED UNDER IRS 501(C)(3).

*NOTE: THESE ACTIVITIES ARE STILL SUBJECT TO REASONABLE TIME, PLACE, AND MANNER RESTRICTIONS.*

**§ 1306. ENFORCEMENT AND PENALTIES**

**(A) ANY VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE IS A CIVIL INFRACTION PUNISHABLE BY:**

- A WARNING FOR A FIRST OFFENSE;
- A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$150 FOR SUBSEQUENT OFFENSES;
- REVOCATION OF ANY ISSUED SOLICITATION PERMIT.

**(B) LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS OR CODE OFFICERS MAY ENFORCE THIS ORDINANCE.**

**SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY**

IF ANY PROVISION OF THIS ORDINANCE IS HELD TO BE INVALID OR UNCONSTITUTIONAL, SUCH INVALIDITY SHALL NOT AFFECT THE REMAINING PROVISIONS.

**SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE**

THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT 30 DAYS AFTER PASSAGE, IN ACCORDANCE WITH APPLICABLE LAW.

RESOLUTION 2025-15**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWN OF BRENTWOOD MAYOR AND  
COUNCIL ESTABLISHING A SOLICITATION PERMIT FEE**

**WHEREAS**, the Mayor and Council of the Town of Brentwood desires to regulate solicitation activities within its municipal limits to protect the safety, privacy, and well-being of its residents; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the interest of the public to ensure that persons engaged in door-to-door solicitation are properly identified and registered with the municipality; and

**WHEREAS**, the Town of Brentwood finds it appropriate and reasonable to impose a fee for the issuance of solicitation permits in order to defray administrative and enforcement costs;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF BRENTWOOD, MARYLAND, AS FOLLOWS:**

**SECTION 1. Solicitation Permit Required**

All individuals or entities wishing to engage in door-to-door solicitation within the municipal boundaries of Brentwood, Maryland must first obtain a solicitation permit issued by the Town Administrator or other designated official, in accordance with applicable ordinances and procedures.

**SECTION 2. Permit Fee Established**

The fee for a solicitation permit shall be as follows:

- **Individual Solicitor Permit:** \$60.00 per person, valid for one (1) year. Additional solicitors may be added at \$25.00 each.
- **Organization Group Permit:** \$150.00 flat fee, covering up to 5 solicitors, valid for one (1) year. Additional solicitors may be added at \$25.00 each.

This fee is non-refundable and due at the time of application.

**SECTION 3. Exemptions**

Religious or political organizations are exempt from the permit requirement.

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that this Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

## Chapter 283

### TREES

§ 283-1.	Purpose.	§ 283-5.	Official street tree species.

#### GENERAL REFERENCES

Weed control — See Ch. 44, Art. 1.

Destruction of public property — See Ch. 200.

#### § 283-1. Purpose.

The purpose of this chapter is to preserve, protect and promote the urban forest of Brentwood, which is part of a large ecosystem which contributes significantly to air, noise and visual pollution control, moderates climate extremes, promotes sound energy conservation and has a significant aesthetic value affecting property values and the Town's quality of life; and to establish a Town Tree Committee to be responsible for the tree program which regulates the planting, maintenance and removal of trees in public places. Other goals of this chapter are to promote public awareness of and pride in urban forests, to observe Arbor Day and to become a "Tree City, USA" community.

#### § 283-2. Scope.

All trees in the public domain in Brentwood are considered a part of the Town's urban forest and are subject to the provisions of this chapter.

#### § 283-3. Town Tree Committee.

- A. **Creation.** There shall be created a committee to be known and designated as the "Town Tree Committee" composed of five members. The terms of the members shall be three years. All members shall serve without pay. Vacancies caused by death, resignations or otherwise shall be filled by the Mayor with the approval of the Council.
- B. **Duties and responsibilities.** It shall be the responsibility of the Committee to study, investigate, counsel, develop and/or update annually and administer a written plan for the care, preservation, pruning, replanting, removal or disposition of trees and shrubs in parks, along streets and in other public areas. Such a plan will be presented annually to the Town Council and, upon its acceptance and approval, shall constitute the Official Comprehensive Town Tree Plan for the Town. A tree may be removed by recommendation of the Committee and the State Forester and approval of the Mayor and Town Council if it is affected by untreatable injurious fungus, insect or other pests.

**§ 283-4. Actions affecting trees restricted; topping and disfigurement prohibited.**

- A. No person shall remove or destroy or cause the removal or destruction of a tree on any public property or undertake construction or other action that may significantly and permanently detract from the health or growth of a tree without first having obtained permission from the Town Clerk, which shall only be issued upon the presentation of an application bearing the approval of the Mayor and Town Council.
- B. It is unlawful as a normal practice for any person, firm or Town department to top any street, park or other tree on public property to such a degree as to remove the normal canopy and disfigure the tree. Trees severely damaged by storms or other causes or certain trees under utility lines or other obstructions where other pruning practices are impractical may be exempted from this chapter (as determined by the Town Tree Committee).

**§ 283-5. Official street tree species.**

The official street tree species list is to be established.

**§ 283-6. Enforcement; violations and penalties.****A. Municipal infractions.**

- (1) Any of the following shall constitute a municipal infraction for which a citation may be issued:
- (a) Doing any of the acts prohibited in § 283-4 without written permission.
  - (b) Any violation of an order of the Tree Committee, including but not limited to the violation or nonperformance of conditions imposed in connection with the issuance of a permit.<sup>1</sup>
- (2) The fine for each violation shall be \$50 per tree affected, plus \$25 per inch of tree circumference greater than 24 inches, measured 4 1/2 feet above ground level, with a maximum fine of \$100 per tree affected; and a fine of \$200 for each repeat of that offense.

**B. Misdemeanors.**

- (1) It shall be a misdemeanor to do any of the following:
- (a) Any of the acts specified above to three or more trees which are part of the urban forest, whether or not such trees are located on the same property.
  - (b) Any of the acts prohibited after permission has been denied.
- (2) A misdemeanor violation of this chapter shall be punishable by a mandatory fine of \$50 for each tree affected, plus \$25 per inch of tree circumference greater than 24 inches, measured 4 1/2 feet above ground level, to a maximum of \$500 per tree or such other greater maximum as may be permitted by state law. The minimum fine may be suspended only upon a finding that the violation was the first offense by the party charged and that there was no willingness involved.<sup>2</sup>

**§ 283-7. Exceptions.**

No permission shall be required when performing professionally accepted tree maintenance.



1. Do you walk or bike around the Town of Brentwood?



### 2. Why do you walk or bike?




3. Do you feel safe when you walk or bike around the Town of Brentwood?

4. If you choose "Not Safe" for Q3, what are the reasons? (Choose all that apply)








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

## **Siembra Arte**

Edith López Estrada (they/them) also known as Siembra Arte is a queer, mixed-race artist, who began creating art as a practice to sustain their physical, spiritual, emotional, and mental well-being. Edith chose the alias "Siembra Arte" (Spanish words meaning: to sow seeds of art) in hopes that their art would support communities' connection to nature and art.

Siembra Arte enjoys creating murals and public art for their communities. Similar to planting a seed in hopes for a flower, Siembra Arte paints in hopes of bringing joy, unity and connection to nature in spaces. In their art you will often find references to their indigenous ancestral practices, like handmade craftwork, curanderismo, and tending the land through flower cultivation and agricultural work.

When you invest in their art, you are not only supporting them as an artist, you are also investing in their communities. They will be distributing 75% of profit of art print sales to LGBTQIA+, Immigrant, Black, Indigenous, and People of Color.

Siembra Arte's art has been featured by Dupont Underground, Calle Libre Street Art Festival in DC, and Philly's Grid Magazine. They have permanent mural installations in Philadelphia, PA, Washington, DC, and Columbia, MO.

Siembra Arte lives, works, and grows in Brentwood, MD with their partner, Sasha, and their non-human animal companions.








