This form must be received by close of business on April 10, 2023, in order to obtain a mail-in ballot for the May 1, 2023, election. In-person ballot pick-up must be done by April 28, 2023.

WARNINGS: Anyone who willfully signs any false application or oath, or who willfully does any act contrary to the terms and provisions of the Brentwood election laws with intent to cast an illegal vote or to aid another in doing so, or who willfully violates any of the provisions of such laws, or who applies for a ballot under any other name than his/her own, shall upon conviction, be subject to a fine of \$100 or imprisonment for not more than thirty (30) days or both, in the discretion of the Court. A mail-in ballot will not be sent unless the applicant is registered to vote in elections for the Town of Brentwood. No voter may vote in-person once the voter's mail-in ballot is received and registered by the Brentwood Election Supervisors.

INFORMATION ABOUT THE APPLICATION FOR MAIL-IN BALLOT

HOW TO VOTE BY MAIL-IN BALLOT

1. Complete this application and return it to the Supervisor of Elections by the deadline.
2. The Supervisor of Elections will issue you a mail-in ballot, either by mail or in person, when she/he has received this completed application and determined that you are qualified to vote by mail-in ballot.
3. Mark the mail-in ballot and return it to the Supervisor of Elections promptly.

DEADLINE FOR RECEIPT OF COMPLETED APPLICATION

The Supervisor of Elections must receive this completed application by Monday, April 10, 2023 COB (close of business) and the Mail-in Ballot MUST be postmarked on or before April 24, 2023 or hand delivered to the Town Hall by COB April 28, 2023.

HOW TO VOTE IF YOU NEED ASSISTANCE

1. If you need assistance to complete this application because of a disability or inability to read or write:
 - (a) You may receive assistance from any person other than a candidate on the ballot, your employer or an agent of your employer, or an officer or agent of your union.
 - (b) The person assisting you to fill in this application must complete the Certification of Assistance portion of the application. If you are unable to sign this application, the assistant should print your name, followed by his/her initials.
2. If you need to designate an individual to pick up and deliver your mail-in ballot:
 - (a) Complete, with assistance, if necessary, the Designation of Agent form provided by the Supervisor of Elections. This form designates an individual to act as your agent and authorizes that individual to pick up and deliver your mail-in ballot.
 - (b) The agent must be at least 18 years old and not a candidate on the ballot.
 - (c) The agent must sign, under penalty of perjury, an affidavit that the ballot was delivered to you, marked by you, sealed in an envelope in the agent's presence, and returned in person by the agent to the Supervisor of Elections.

NOTE: You are exempt from this identification requirement if you are entitled to vote a mail-in ballot under federal law, including the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Mail-in Voting Act or the Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act.

If you have not previously submitted identification or if you have been advised or suspect that the personal identification you provided on your voter registration application (your MVA identification number or, if you do not have an MVA identification number, the last four digits of your social security number) could not be verified by election officials, please include with this application one of the following documents:

1. A copy of a current and valid photo identification; or
2. A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document that shows your name and address.

If you are required to submit identification and do not provide the required identification with this application or with your mail-in ballot, your mail-in ballot will not be canvassed unless your identification information is presented or submitted to the Supervisor of Elections before your mail-in ballot is processed.
